FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends;

On November 9, we will hold our annual Charge Conference. We will celebrate our ministries, look to the future, elect officers, approve some policies, and finalize our 2009 Budget. Between now and November 9, there will be many important meetings to prepare for Charge Conference. While you will hear my State of the Church Address at Charge Conference, there are a number of items I'd like to call your attention to at this time.

Last Sunday Pastor Kim preached the sermon, *Call 911: This Church Is On Fire!* based on the text from Acts 2:1-12, 43-47. In her message she highlighted some of the ministries of our church. We really do have some ministries at Surfside that are on fire. There are some good reasons that this is true.

First, we have a great staff. We have a group of hard working, creative, committed disciples serving this congregation. While our staff comes from diverse backgrounds, has differing interests, and has varying accents—our staff is working together as a team with a common goal to serve Christ and His Church. Every Monday at Noon, we gather as a staff to pray, share what is going on in our ministry areas, and coordinate with each other and the ministries of our congregation.

Second, we have great facilities. Our Sanctuary is a beautiful place for divine worship—from the Noah's Ark theme to the stained glass, to the cross of Christ hanging as the focal point of the building. We have wonderful spaces for fellowship, classes, meals, recreation, and discipleship groups of all kinds. Many of the new ministries at Surfside would not be possible were it not for our facilities.

Third, we have a great congregation. I have been thoroughly impressed by the commitment and willingness of a large number of persons to volunteer in so many ways. Many congregations are full of people who are content to just go along as things happen to be. That's not true of Surfside. I am proud to serve as the Pastor of a congregation where people are coming to me asking what can be done to move forward and grow the Kingdom of God through the ministries of Surfside UMC. We even have persons who haven't joined the church yet who are stepping up to help. You are a special people!

And fourth, we have a great God. You know, when you are serving a God like we have, it is easy to do great things. Our God has revealed Himself to us as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We are invited to share in a dynamic relationship with God through the saving grace offered to us by Jesus the Christ. Through His atoning sacrifice on the Cross, we find forgiveness and new life.

To those of you who are not currently active in our church, if you want to be a part of a ministry that recognizes the Lordship of Jesus Christ, values loving relationships with God and one another, and is committed to helping people grow as disciples of the Master, then come and join us. Surfside UMC is truly *Alive With God's Love* and we have room for you!

MARY BAKER CIRCLE

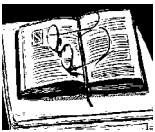

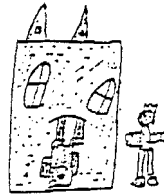
ADULT MUSIC PROGRAMS

That's it for now, my friends. I hope you have a great fall. Remember, I am here to serve you! Please let me know if there is anything I can do!

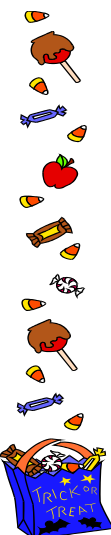
