FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends;

During our worship services on Sunday, February 15, you had the opportunity to hear from Mrs. Rosella Croft, the Chairperson of our congregation's Staff-Parish Relations Committee. She shared with us the duties of the committee and she invited the members of the committee to stand so that you would know who they are. The current members of this committee and those who rotated off at the end of 2008 have been very active. One of the major accomplishments of the SPRC over the last several months has been to establish job titles and job descriptions for each member of the church staff.

After discussing the current pastoral needs of the congregation and the gifts and graces of our two appointed clergy, the SPRC with input from Pastor Kim and me prioritized the twelve responsibilities as set forth in the *Discipline*. As Senior Pastor, the top four duties assigned to me are: 1) Leading Worship and Preaching. 2) Administration. 3) Serving as the Leader in the Congregation. and, 4) Serving as a Leader among leaders with the lay leadership in the congregation.

For our Associate Pastor, Kim Eanes, the committee first decided to change her title to Parish Pastor. Pastor Kim's top four priorities as assigned by the SPRC with her input are: 1) Teaching. 2) Visiting. 3) Counseling. and, 4) Personal and Spiritual Growth.

For general information, the four responsibilities of clergy which did not make the top four list in either of our priority lists are 1) Enabler. 2) Evangelism. 3) Community Leader. and, 4) Denominational/Ecumenical Responsibilities.

For the present time, feel free to approach either Pastor Kim or me about any pastoral need. Keep in mind, however, that Pastor Kim and I are trying to fulfill our responsibilities to the congregation by maintaining the priorities determined by the Staff-Parish Relations Committee.

While all the lay members of our staff have detailed job descriptions, I want to highlight two of our staff members whose job titles and expectations have changed in 2009.

First, Kesha Sims is now our Office Manager. In addition to her general responsibilities as secretary, she is responsible for scheduling, supervising our office volunteers, and she has taken on the responsibilities of bookkeeper for our church and preschool. We are utilizing volunteers throughout the week to serve as receptionists to answer phones and greet visitors to allow Kesha the time to perform her many tasks. While Kesha is learning our new accounting system and updating our records she is staying extremely busy. I appreciate all of you who have and are volunteering to help her with everything from counting money to assembling our newsletters.

Second, Leigh Gamble is no longer our Children's Music Director. She has now assumed responsibility for all of our children's ministries except VBS and her title is now Director of Children's Ministries. This will enable us to provide greater ministry opportunities for our children from preschool through grade 5.

Let's offer our thanks to the members of the SPRC who strive to provide and the staff necessary to fulfill our mandate to Make Disciples For Jesus Christ.

A NOTE FROM THE PARISH PASTOR

Author J. Allan Petersen tells about a flight he took on a 747 out of Brazil. Petersen was awakened from sleep by a strong voice announcing, "We have a very serious emergency". Three engines had quit because of fuel contamination and the fourth was expected to go at any second. The plane began to drop and turn in the night, preparing for an emergency landing.

At first, the situation seemed unreal to Petersen, but when the steward barked, "Prepare for impact", he found himself – and everyone around him – praying. As Petersen buried his head in his lap and pulled up his knees, he said, "Oh God, thank you. Thank you for the incredible privilege of knowing you. Life has been wonderful".

As the plane approached the ground, Petersen's last cry was, "Oh God, my wife! My children!"

Petersen survived the crash. And as he wandered around the airport in a daze, aching all over, he found he couldn't speak, but his mind was racing. *What were my last words? What was the bottom line?* As he remembered, Petersen had his answer: relationship. Reunited with his wife and sons, Petersen found that all he could say to them over and over again was, "I appreciate you, I appreciate you!"

We have so many awesome relationships forming....and maintaining....here at the Surfside United Methodist Church – relationships with each other – relationships with God Almighty. Let's be truly thankful for those relationships. Let's feel truly blessed by those relationships. Let's be genuinely appreciative of those relationships. 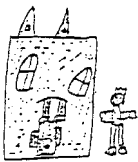

Dr. Craig Miller will be teaching a new series of biblical studies courses that examine the Old and New Testaments, each in their own canonical environment, in ways that interweave historical, cultural, linguistic, and theological perspectives. Offered at a nominal fee of \$40, the courses will form a "core curriculum" that will lead to an SUMC Program Completion Certificate. The studies will provide you a depth of understanding that is fresh and challenging in an environment that promotes open, rigorous, and respectful discussion. Each course is 8 weeks in length, each session 1.5 hours. The first course, "God's Gradual Revealing," will be offered from 6-7:30 p.m. on Thursdays from April 16 through June 4. 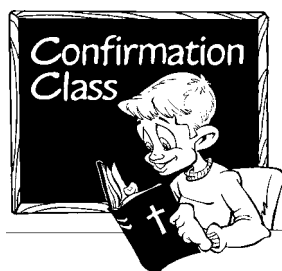
